Since its signing into law in 1990, the American with Disabilities Act has provided required accommodations for those with disabilities.

Since the web was still in its infancy then, websites were not covered in the original act. However with the rise of the modern web and the impact the Internet has on all of our lives, the act has been expanded to cover website accessibility for all.




Legality
